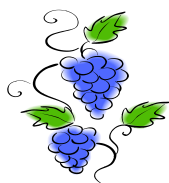

Fore-Thought



We recently celebrated the Harvest Thanksgiving with a Celtic Communion service, based on the Iona community's style of worship. Though few in number, our celebration seemed to hold real meaning.

The generous donations of dried goods were sent to Secours Catholique. In the same week, I received the Bishop's Advent Appeal letter, All Saints, Vendée has normally supported "local" charities, and the PCC has already decided which they should be. Today I found this suggestion from a Facebook friend:



During the Lenten season, I did much the same with a box of un-needed items being donated to Emmaus. Please seriously consider following the reverse calendar, we have so much, and there are those who have so little.

Advent is, like Lent, a time for reflection and preparation. The theme of readings and teachings during Advent is often the preparation for the Second Coming, while also commemorating the First Coming of Christ at Christmas. We usually have an Advent wreath, or crown placed on the Lord's Table.

The concept of the Advent wreath originated among German Lutherans in the 16th Century. However, it was not until three centuries later that the modern Advent wreath took shape. The modern Advent wreath, with its candles representing the Sundays of Advent, originated from an 1839 initiative by Johann Hinrich Wichern, a Protestant pastor in Germany and a pioneer in urban mission work among the poor. In view of the impatience of the children he taught as they awaited Christmas, he made a ring of wood, with nineteen small red tapers and four large white candles. Every morning a small candle was lit, and every Sunday a large candle. Custom has retained only the large candles.

The wreath crown is traditionally made of fir tree branches knotted with a red ribbon and decorated with pine cones, holly, laurel, and sometimes mistletoe. It is also an ancient symbol signifying several things; first, the crown symbolises victory, in addition to its round form evoking the sun and its return each year. The number four represents, in addition to the four weeks of Advent, the four seasons and the four cardinal virtues, and the green colour is a sign of life and hope. The fir tree is a symbol of strength and laurel a symbol of victory over sin and suffering. The latter two, with the holly, do not lose their leaves, and thus represent the eternity of God. The flames of candles are the representation of the Christmas light approaching and bringing hope and peace, as well as the symbol of the struggle against darkness. For Christians, this crown is also the symbol of Christ the King, the holly recalling the crown of thorns resting on the head of Christ.



So, in the weeks before Advent, I urge you to reflect on what meaning Christ has in our daily lives, and how we may become more like Him.

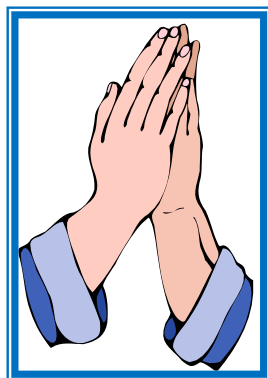

At the last council meeting it was suggested that not all the congregation know the council members and a little piece in Grapevine might help, so, here is my entry....

My full name is Douglas John Green and I was born in West Bromwich, Staffordshire (now part of Sandwell, West Midlands). I studied at West Bromwich Grammar School and later the University of Aston in Birmingham where I obtained a B.Sc. Degree in Electrical Engineering. In my working life I have had only one employer, the Midlands Electricity Board (which became Midlands Electricity plc after privatisation). I started as a Student Apprentice, held progressive Commercial Engineering posts throughout the Midlands and finished my career at the Headquarters as Marketing Services Manager. During my working life I was also involved in various voluntary positions such as helping to run a Cub and Scout group, being a servicing volunteer for the RNIB "Talking Books" scheme, being on the PCC of our church (and later Deputy Warden) and I was also recruited as a Justice of the Peace and served as a Magistrate until we moved to France. In view of my service to industry and the community my name was put forward for the award of an MBE and the Investiture Ceremony was at Buckingham Palace.

I am married to Chris, also on Council, and we have been married 51 years. We have a daughter who lives in Boston, Lincs. and a son who lives in Birmingham. We have one granddaughter. We bought our house in France in 1997 initially as a holiday home after spending touring caravan holidays in the south of France for many years. We moved here permanently in 2000. When we arrived, the nearest Anglican services were in Poitou-Charente and we attended a service once a month at a church near Melle. Here we met other British people from this region, including Brian and Pam Davies and a "Vendée Fellowship" was formed later to develop into ASV after Brian had been trained and ordained and agreed to lead this new venture. I was one of the initial Wardens and have been on council for most of the time since the formation of ASV.

ADVANTAGES:

If you set up a standing order (virement) through your French bank, online, it is cost-free. If you need help doing this, please just ask me, or other council members.

You stay in total control of what you give – the standing order (virement) can be changed at any time, but only by you!

Only the treasurer knows how much you give per month.

You know what you are giving, and exactly when the money comes out of your account, and so your budgeting is much easier.

If you complete a French tax form, then you will get a rebate of 66% at the end of each financial year in which you have made a contribution. That means that a monthly virement of 30€ per month, will only cost you 10€ after tax. A monthly virement of 60€ will only cost you 20€ etc!

If your French tax bill is small, then you will pay no tax at all.

ASV can plan ahead much more effectively, as it knows what contributions are coming in, rather than guessing who is going to be at church!

If you would like to physically put something into the collection plate each service, then there should be small cards which you can collect on your way into church, which you can put into the collection plate as it is passed round.

DISADVANTAGES:

I can't think of any, so why not come and join the party!

British residents:

If you do not have a French bank account, but would like to support the work of ASV on a regular basis, then please contact me, and I can help you. Please note, you cannot use tax-efficient giving in both France and the UK.
