

# 4-Thought April 2023



So the spring equinox has been and gone, and we look forward to increasingly longer hours of daylight. So I got curious, (yes I know, one day that will get me into trouble!!)

What I wondered is the connection between the spring equinox and Easter, well I hope you are sitting comfortably.....

Easter occurs on the first Sunday after the "paschal full Moon." Put simply, this is the first full Moon immediately following the vernal (spring) equinox.

However, that's not the full story because Easter isn't based on the actual Moon or equinox date! There is a curious connection between the Moon and Easter. Easter is what's known as a "movable feast"—in other words, a religious holiday that may fall on a different calendar date from year to year.

Officially, Easter is observed on the Sunday following the first full Moon that occurs on or after the March equinox. Occasionally, the Church's dates will not coincide with the astronomical dates, in which case this basic rule would not apply. For example, if the equinox were to occur on March 21 and the full Moon were to occur two days later, on March 23, Easter would be observed on the first Sunday after March 23. But, thanks to the motions of our planet and the Moon, as well as the inelasticity of calendars, calculating Easter's date can get more complicated sometimes!

The full Moon nearest to Easter can change. Sometimes, it's the full Moon that occurs in March and sometimes it's the full Moon that occurs in April. In 2023, April's full Moon (April 5-6) will be nearest to Easter (April 9).

Through the Gospels, we can determine that Sunday was the day that Jesus was raised from the dead. In John 20 verse 1, the resurrection story starts with "Early on the first day of the week..." According to the Jewish way of calculating days, the first day of the week was Sunday. It's actually because the resurrection occurred on Sunday that Christians observe Sundays as the Sabbath or holy day to honour God. Up until this point, Saturdays were considered holy.

Jesus came into the world as God and man to bring light, life, and a way for people to have a close relationship with God. God's plan was for Jesus to be crucified on the cross to put to death the power of sin in us. But it was also His plan for Jesus to be raised to life, allowing us to live in unity with him for eternity.

If Christ was not raised from the dead, there would be no Christianity! The death and resurrection of Jesus are so important that all of the Bible from Genesis to Revelation point to this event. It is the pinnacle moment in God's plan, for us to be alive in Christ.

Easter is not just about Jesus coming to life. Easter is about celebrating OUR new life through him! "Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him" (Romans 6:8). We are free from condemnation, sin, and death! Through Christ, we can call God our Father.

There is nothing wrong with celebrating with eggs, chocolate, and whatever else. Do so without condemnation, but remember what Easter is really about. Bunnies, eggs, and Easter dresses come and go, but the spiritual meaning of Easter is a delight that will last forever.

May you each have a very blessed Easter.

## **REVISION OF THE ASV ELECTORAL ROLL**

The Electoral Roll of a church is completely updated every six years - this was last done in 2019. Once updated, the Electoral Roll Officer is required to revise the Roll each year shortly before the Annual Meeting (AGM). The Council has now fixed the date for the AGM and it will take place after the service on Sunday May 14th 2023. The revision has to be completed not later than 15 days before the AGM (i.e. April 29th.) and not earlier than 28 days before the AGM (i.e. April 16th). Once it has been revised, the Roll is "frozen" until after the AGM has taken place.

If anyone wishes to join the ASV Electoral Roll, please complete an Application form and return it to me as soon as possible. An application form can be obtained from me or you can download the copy found elsewhere in Grapevine. Completed Application forms will be approved by Council and names added to the Roll. If anyone wishes to have their name removed from the Roll, please contact me. If you are on the Roll, and wish to remain on the Roll then there is nothing you need to do.

Only people on the Electoral Roll are allowed to nominate or stand for Churchwarden or a Council Member. Again, only Roll members may attend the AGM and vote in elections or for motions at the AGM. In other words, membership of the Electoral Roll is the way to be able to take an active part in the life of the church. Thank you to everyone who took part and travelled from different parts of the Vendee it was a truly ecumenical Meeting.







### KORG SP280

It is difficult to believe that it is 8 years since the old church keyboard was written off due to the damage caused by the excessively damp conditions in the Vestry at Puy de Serre. Some of you may remember the crackling sound when the volume was increased or the time it played on its own during a sermon!

Extra life was gained by using external speakers plugged into the earphone socket but this was short-lived and since the lockdown, Ann and I have used our own keyboards for the services.

An unexpected donation from an old friend of ours (unconnected with ASV) triggered an appeal for a new instrument with the proviso that a suitable strong, waterproof case should be provided.

The result, making its entrance at Puy de Serre on the 12<sup>th</sup> of March, was the Korg SP280 - the successor to our old Korg SP250.



May I thank the members and friends of All Saints Vendée for their generous contributions which have made this acquisition possible.

It is 20 years since I started playing for services for All Saints Vendée, initially at La Merlatière following the untimely death of George Nichols.

When La Merlatière's congregation moved to La Chapelle Achard, Allan Rothwell became the fulltime Organist. From 2005 with the departure of Neville Dilkes, I took over playing for services at Puy de Serre.


I shall still use my own Keyboard at the monthly service at La Chapelle Palluau.
