## **Bishop's Advent Appeal 2022: Toilet Block for Bishop Hannington School, Mumias, Kenya**

### *In Summary*

In 2020, I launched an appeal to build a classroom for Bishop Hannington School in Mumias, Kenya. I am delighted to say that the classroom was successfully built. Indeed great progress has been made with the construction of other classrooms too. My appeal this year is for a toilet block for this same school.

### *Why this Project?*

The appeal follows a personal request from Bishop Joseph Wandera. I first met Joseph in the Hague, when he was in the Netherlands studying for a research degree. We renewed our friendship on a Holy Land pilgrimage a few years ago. It was a particular pleasure to meet him again at the Lambeth Conference in Canterbury, pictured with me here at the Christian Aid stand in the resources tent. So this Appeal is one way of carrying forward the missional intentions of the Lambeth Conference. This region of Kenya is affected by extremes of weather induced by climate change.

### *The story of Bishop Hannington Academy*

In 2013 the Kenyan government introduced a policy of free primary education. This led to big increases in the numbers of children enrolled in schools:

improving primary school participation rates is a key factor in development and wellbeing.

However, the number of teachers did not increase, and classrooms were congested. Aware of this

challenge, the Anglican Diocese of Mumias established the Bishop Hannington Academy as their contribution towards better quality primary education in a Christian context.

### *Building on Success*

Back in 2019, the school had just two classrooms with three teachers. As we can see from the photo at the head of this letter, there has been a lot of progress since then with new building.

Because the school is growing, the Diocese now needs to install a purpose-built toilet block. UN sponsored World Toilet Day (19 November) leaves us in no doubt as to the crucial importance of providing good hygiene facilities.

We have already helped Dr. Wandera to build a classroom for the school. This Appeal gives us the opportunity to provide an "ablutions block" for the girls and boys, to give them toilets and the possibility of better hygiene while they are at school. 'Days for Girls' (which featured prominently at the Lambeth Conference) has brought home to us all the importance of proper hygiene provision if girls are to manage at school. Better hygiene means a better education. Better education will change their world.

### *The cost of the project*

Bishop Joseph has given detailed estimates for the project. It will cost 2.4 million Kenyan Shillings, about 20,000 euros, to build a new ablutions block. (That is very good value by West European standards!) Our Advent Appeal will therefore be a very tangible expression of support for the Diocese of Mumias's mission to educate primary school children.

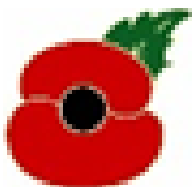

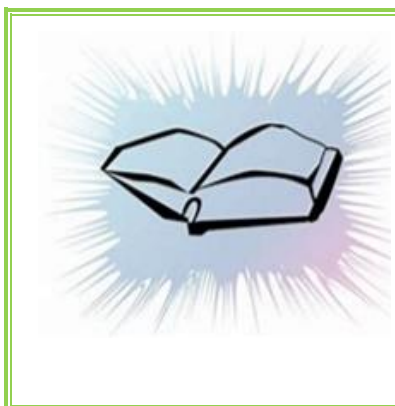
..... and just to add:

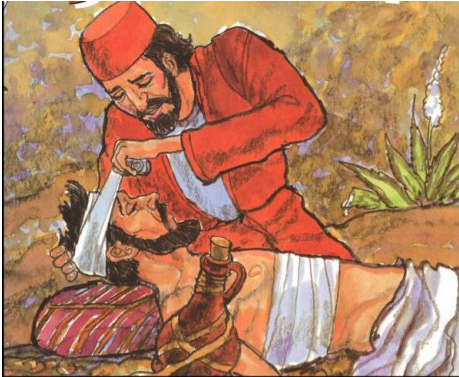

## The Good Samaritan.

Please read Luke chapter 10 verses 29 to 37.



There is no better way to explain who one's neighbour is from a Christian standing than to refer to **The Good Samaritan**.

Luke shares lessons for all when he quotes Jesus explaining to a law expert, who his neighbour is.

### The Good Samaritan.

A man was heading to Jerusalem when he was mugged, the assailants took everything he had, and left him for dead. He could not move, and hoped for a passerby to come to his rescue.

The first person to pass by was a priest, Upon seeing the wounded man, the priest went his way and never bothered to help. The same thing happened with the second passerby, a Levite !

Then came a Samaritan, he immediately felt pity for the hurt man and decided to help. He attended to his injuries and went a step further to take him to a Inn where he could be looked after properly and paid for them to do so.

When Jesus was telling this story, he turned the law expert and asked " Who among the three, can the wounded man call his neighbour ?" Without a doubt, the law expert answered "The Samaritan "

Then Jesus concluded by declaring "Go and do likewise" !

### **Moral lesson:**

We should love everyone the way we would want them to love us. That is the best way we can show our love to God.

The priest and the Levite claimed to be men of God, but could not do the Godly act of helping the wounded man. In essence, they did not love God!!

Let us pray to God and thank him for being at our side,  
And for all the new opportunities he gives us,  
We pray for his forgiveness, his huge love ♥ and blessings.  
And pray for the strength to follow in his footsteps.  
AMEN.

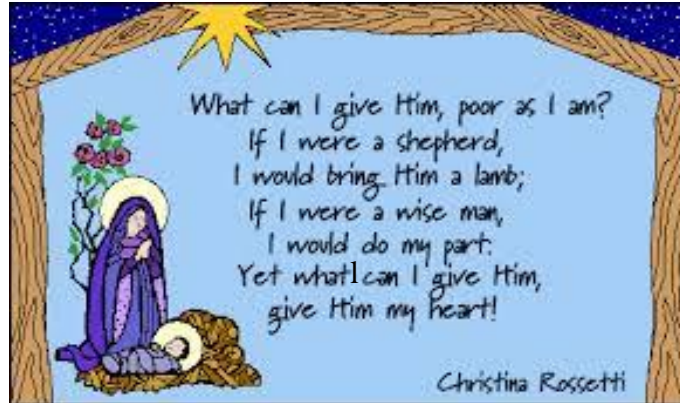

*May our gifts be received with gratitude, and may we be evermore generous.*



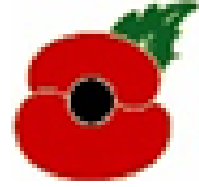
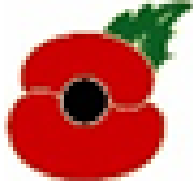
