# 4-Thought December 2023



We're moving towards the end of the year, yet we're at the beginning of the Church's year. Advent Sunday is the start of a new year, a time of preparation to celebrate the birth of our Saviour. More importantly to me, a time to consolidate preparation for His second coming.

We don't know the time or the hour Jesus will return; our heavenly Father knows. We are the church, the "bride of Christ", and we can place our hope in Jesus that He is coming back for us!

Christians around the world have waited for the return of Jesus Christ for millennia. The Bible says no man knows, and not even the angels know, the time of Jesus' coming. But when Saint Paul spoke to the Thessalonians, he said children of light will know the season.

So how can we as children of light prepare for that wonderful day of Jesus' second coming?

Here are five ways to spiritually prepare for Jesus' return:

**Pray:** If you want to know what God knows, begin by asking Him...

**Listen:** Sometimes, we think we know what God wants for us, but God's knowledge isn't always obvious, if we are too busy telling God what we want, we have no time to hear what He wants.

**Watch:** Saint Paul said we need to watch and be ready. We do not watch with fear and trembling, but we watch with joy and gladness.

**Store:** When Jesus spoke of His own return, He used the story of the 10 virgins. The kind of oil we need to store are those things that feed our light within: Bible study, prayer, knowledge of Jesus, church attendance and wholesome music. All of these things add light to our lives and our spirits and will help us prepare for when Jesus returns.

**Improve:** God does not expect us to be perfect, and thankfully perfection isn't required of us in order to see Him at His return. What is expected is that each day we are a little better than the day before.

If Jesus came today, He would accept our progress and count us as His, no matter how small our steps forward are. Every step moves us forward, even the baby steps.

We don't have to be perfect; we just have to do our best to make each day count as an improvement. One day at a time is all we ever have to worry about.

We have a negative balance for the month: -1213.97 €


Three large bills this month contributed to the deficit. We hope that November's quiz will redress the balance. Any more fundraising ideas will be gratefully received!

It is a time of Spiritual reflection and the four outer candles of the Advent Wreath are often said to signify Hope, Love, Joy and Peace.



# Something to chew over...



Christmas is also sometimes known as Xmas. Some people don't think it's correct to call Christmas 'Xmas' as that takes the 'Christ' (Jesus) out of Christmas. (As Christmas comes from Christ-Mass, the Church service that celebrated the birth of Jesus.)





But that is not quite right! In the Greek language and alphabet, the letter that looks like an X is the Greek letter chi / X (pronounced 'khee' rhymes with 'key' or 'kye' rhymes with 'eye') which is the first letter of the Greek word for Christ, Christos.

The early church used the first two letters of Christos in the Greek alphabet 'chl' and 'rho' to create a monogram (symbol) to represent the name of Jesus. This looks like an X with a small p on the top: \$\mathbb{P}\$

The symbol of a fish is sometimes used by Christians (you might see a fish sticker on a car or someone wearing a little fish badge). This comes from the time when the first Christians had to meet in secret, as the Romans wanted to kill them (before Emperor Constantine became a Christian). Jesus had said that he wanted to make his followers 'Fishers of Men', so people started to use that symbol.

When two Christians met, one person drew half a basic fish shape (often using their foot in the dust on the ground) and the other person drew the other half of the fish. The Greek word for fish is 'lkthus' or 'lchthys'. There are five Greek letters in the word. It can also make up a sentence of Christian beliefs 'le-sous Christos Theou Huios So-te-r' which in English means "Jesus Christ, Son of God, Saviour". The second letter of these five letter is X or Christos!

So Xmas can also mean Christmas; but it should also be pronounced 'Christmas' rather than 'ex-mas'!
