4-Thought May 2024



As I write this, I'm sitting watching clouds race across the sky. They look grey and very water laden, the flags in the garden are horizontal to their pole, the wind is from the north east. It's cold and chilly and about to become very damp. Sorry if this sounds like a sequel to last month's 4thought, it is not meant to be. Just that the weather still dominates most of our conversations. Historically, I suppose, our ancestors were much closer to dependency on what they could produce from the land, than we are. We head to the supermarket, and buy whatever we need, from wherever in the world it is produced. Food played a big part in the life of Jesus too. It is an unmistakable theme in the miracles of Jesus. There is no aspect of humanity that Jesus ignored, including our need for food.

Of course, Jesus ate. He drank. He attended dinner parties—lots of them. The beginning of His earthly ministry included the miracle of turning water into wine at a wedding reception, and before He ascended back into heaven, He cooked His disciples' breakfast with fish He'd miraculously jammed into their nets

In Matthew 14, we read about the "Feeding of the Five Thousand." Scripture says five thousand men were present besides women and children, meaning there were likely closer to 15,000 people gathered around Jesus—and He fed every single one of them until they were full.

This month we commemorate Pentecost on the 19th May, which signifies the 50th day after Easter when the apostles prayed together and the Holy Spirit descended on them. They received the "gift of tongues" – the ability to speak in other languages. The festival nowadays is of course more commonly known as Whitsuntide.

Pentecost is known as a sign of first fruits. This is significant on several counts, one of the reasons that the Gospel is 'good news' is that not only is it about a conquering of death, but it is also about living life differently. Following Pentecost life becomes a union between God and people, which takes place through the indwelling of the Spirit of God – beginning on the Pentecost Sunday which we learn about from Acts 2. The Good News is that life can now be lived on a different level, in a relationship with God through His Spirit.


Garden Open Day in Vouvant on Sunday 19th May from 10hr00 to 17hr00

This time round ASV donations accounted for 3 trolley-loads full :-)

60% of the families that attend have children, so your generosity continues to protect them against hunger, illness and all the evils of poverty in challenging times.



IMPORTANT CHANGES TO U.K. VOTING FROM OVERSEAS

On Tuesday 16th January there were important changes to the UK's electoral system. One change was to remove the 15-year limit on the rights of eligible British citizens to vote in U.K. Parliament elections.

The online registration process is quite straightforward and shown below is the information sent out by The British Embassy Paris.

Safety in a little plastic box

Whether we like it or not, or whether we admit it to ourselves, or not, we are, all of us, getting older! Some of us, whether by choice or by loss, are living on our own. Even those of us blessed to have partners may not always be in a position to help if a medical crisis situation arises. I have recently been told about an excellent free system run by the Lions Club International called Lions SOS. It seems to me a wonderful and very practical idea for us all to take up.

'LIONS SOS' involves placing written vital information relating to the person's health in a small plastic box stored in the refrigerator door. This immediately tells the emergency services about the patient's state of health and medications and can save vital time. On arrival they will see the 'LIONS SOS' sticker on the back of the front door and know that an information sheet is available in the refrigerator.

Using this system can help to bring peace of mind to the beneficiaries, elderly, isolated people, those weakened by illness, those with disabilities and others, as well as their families.

The little plastic boxes and full instructions may be collected FREE OF CHARGE from many Pharmacies across much of France, certainly in both the Vienne and Deux-Sevres

Geoff and I have already collected one each. WHAT A GREAT IDEA!
