My grateful thanks to those who responded to my plea in last month's Grapevine. Some very thought-provoking answers which will give the Church council plenty to think about.

We're heading to autumn, and soon will be celebrating our Harvest Festival, our appeal is not for perishable goods, but dried so that we can, as in years gone by, donate them to Restos du Coeur.

The Restaurants du Cœur (literally Restaurants of the Heart but meaning Restaurants of Love), is a French charity, the main activity of which is to distribute food packages and hot meals to those in need. The association targets homeless and those with a low or a very low income (single families, old people with a low pension, young adults...). The association also helps people to find housing and supports other projects. This not-for-profit association has the "reconnu d'utilité publique" (recognized as being of public interest) status which exempts it from specific taxes.

The comedian and actor Coluche launched the idea of the Restos du Cœur on 26 September 1985. "I have a little idea, a bit like this... If there are people who would be interested in sponsoring a free soup kitchen, we'd start first in Paris and then spread to France's big cities." The first Resto du Coeur opened on 21 December that year and soon multiplied all over the country. The goal of the founders was to give away 2,000 to 3,000 meals per day; 8.5 million meals were distributed in the first winter alone. In 2018, 130 million meals were served. All Saints Vendée is pleased and proud to be able to support the organisation. We are indebted to Mike Mylod for all he has done as our liaison with the local branch and look forward to welcoming him back once he has recovered from illness. (with thanks to Wikipedia).

HM Queen Elizabeth II (21 April 1926 – 8 September 2022)

Gracious God, we give thanks for the life of your servant Queen Elizabeth, for her faith and her dedication to duty. Bless our nation as we mourn her death and may her example continue to inspire us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Despite her 96 years, her death has come as a shock to many. I'm sure we all have special personal memories in different ways from her long and glorious reign.

From The Bishop in Europe: The Rt Revd Robert Innes, has spoken of his great sadness at the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth. The Queen, who was 96, died this afternoon at Balmoral. In a statement, Bishop Robert offered his condolences to the Royal Family, describing the Queen as a deeply loved and cherished monarch whose Christian faith had been her strength and guide.

"It is with the greatest sadness that we have learned of the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth. On behalf of the Diocese in Europe, I would like to send my condolences to the Royal Family at this painful time. We will remember them in our prayers. Queen Elizabeth's Christian faith was her strength and guide throughout her life. It will be a comfort to us as we mourn her passing."

President Macron said in an address:

She held a special status in France and a special place in the hearts of the French people. No foreign sovereign has climbed the stairs of the Élysée Palace more often than she, who honoured France with six state visits and met each of its presidents. For her, French was not a mere relic of Norman ancestry that persisted in so many customs, but an intimate, cherished language. The Queen of sixteen kingdoms loved France, which loved her back. This evening, the people of the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth are mourning their Queen. The people of France join them in their grief.

She who stood with the giants of the twentieth century on the path of history has now left to join them. The French Republic and the people of France extend their long-standing friendship and deep sorrow to His Majesty the King, to the Royal Family, to His Majesty's Government and to the British people.

He further commented: "to us she was THE Queen."

Let us pray for our newly proclaimed King. That he will be guided by the Lord as he fulfils his duties as the King of the United Kingdom. God save the King.

Below is an excerpt from the British Ambassador's message to the British community at a condolence service held at St. George's on the passing of Her late Majesty The Queen:

Her Majesty was the only monarch that the majority of British people ever knew. She was a constant in our lives and in those of millions of people in the realms, the Commonwealth and the entire world. She embodied what it meant to be British and gave to her nation steadfast leadership, courage, joy, and, when necessary, hope.

Tributes to HM the Queen have flowed in from around the world. But I wanted to mention her relationship with France in particular. As President Macron said, "She loved France and France loved her back". She was a fluent French speaker, courtesy of her mother's desire that she should master the language as a child. She made many visits here during her life. Her first official visit, as Princess Elizabeth, was in 1948 and reminds us of the remarkable continuity that she has represented, connecting us all across generations. Over the years, she met 10 French Presidents and had a deep appreciation of the subtleties of the relations between our countries – our history of shared sacrifice and of friendly rivalry. As she put it once, "the Latin and Anglo-Saxon worlds are like oil and vinegar: very different but you need them both to make a proper dressing."

Her contribution to the relations between our countries will outlast her. As M. le Président put it "Le lien entre la France et le Royaume-Uni est indéfectible. Nous continuerons à le tisser, en suivant le chemin tracé par Sa Majesté la Reine Elizabeth II."

I would like to thank the British community for your support at this sad moment for our nation, and to the many members of the French Government and other leading figures for your displays of condolence.

I will finish by sharing a couplet from the poem 'Floral Tribute' that Simon Armitage, the Poet Laureate has written to mark Her Majesty's passing:

"The country loaded its whole self into your slender hands, Hands that can rest, now, relieved of a century's weight."

The ASV entry reads:-

"From France, the congregations of the Anglican Chaplaincy of All Saints, Vendée wish to record their profound sense of loss following the death of our Sovereign Lady, Queen Elizabeth. We give thanks to God for her life and dedication to duty which was an inspiration to us all. Our thoughts and prayers are with our new sovereign King Charles and all the Royal Family at this sad time."

<u>Future of ASV</u> - We repeat the plea that we need new ideas. The future of All Saints Vendee is in our hands. Please think and pray about this as Hazel specially asked us. If we want our church community to continue, we need to think clearly about our future and do something about it.

<u>Lay involvement</u> - There are many jobs to do to make our church run smoothly but fewer people to do them. We are still looking forward to welcoming "new blood" to join us in any of the present jobs and, also, a volunteer is needed to become our Communications Officer to liaise with external publications for example. We also need a Sacristan at PDS. Please talk to us if you need more information.





Hi

Just got the newsletter and really enjoyed reading it. I do miss the church of the Vendée and the meetings in-between I used to attend in the West.

The church I attend here is losing members - as are so many others but we soldier on trying to get more younger people involved and interested.

On a personal note, I was found to have skin cancer on my cheek which necessitated surgery, testing of the lymph nodes and a skin graft. Thankfully I was given the all-clear last week, just have to go back to the hospital every 4 months and then have a skin check head to toe every 6 months at my doctors. The hospital system here gets knocked, a bit like the NHS, but I found it was marvellous - I was petrified having got to my age and never having had a general aesthetic but from surgeons to ward orderlies they were just awesome.

One really good thing happened in the Cook family this week, my son Neville who transferred from the RN to the RAN in 2007 was promoted to Captain RAN. Talk about a proud mum!! When I was asked, with his wife Angie, to put his new insignia up I thought my heart would burst with pride. Not bad for a young lad who joined as an erk in 1986 and worked his way up through the ranks.



We here are waiting for Spring to arrive, it's been a bad winter on the whole and in the past couple of weeks we've had lots of - temperatures, getting as low as -7 a few times.

Jesus was known as Joseph, the carpenter's son. He didn't seem to be different from other men in Nazareth, yet people flocked to hear Him in the sort of numbers we associate with major football games and rock concerts.

What attracted them? Jesus was a storyteller: we call His stories parables, such as The Parable of the Mustard Seed and the Yeast (Matthew 13:31-35; Mark 4:30-32); The Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 3:18-21), (Luke 10:30-37).

He knew how to weave His message, what He wanted to teach us, into stories about everyday things and events that everyone could relate to. We human beings love stories: as soon as we have learnt a bit of language, we want our parents to tell us stories, and once we know the stories, we don't allow our parents to get them wrong!

When Jesus walked the Earth, there was no television or the internet, so a good storyteller was highly prized. And when His audience discovered that this Story Teller could heal the sick in mind and body, feed the hungry and forgive sins, they knew they were in the presence of someone very special, unique: the Messiah, the Son of God, Our Saviour.
