- 18 Luke the Evangelist
- 26 Cedd, Abbot of Lastingham, Bishop of the East Saxons, 664
- 28 Simon and Jude, Apostles
- 31 Martin Luther, Reformer, 1546

You already know of my attachment to St. Francis. Another name caught my eye on this list, so I read more... St. Cedd of Lastingham.

This month marks 55 years since Martin and I were married, for the first few years we lived in a place called Lichfield famous for its Cathedral of St Chad. Later we moved to North Yorkshire to a small market town called Pickering. Okay, you ask, what is the connection? Well, Lastingham is in an area called Ryedale, about six miles west of Pickering. St Cedd died of the plague in 664 and his brother took over as abbot. The brother? St. Chad, who moved shortly afterwards to Lichfield. Life is full of fascinating coincidences, or God incidences?

We, thankfully, don't know what our days may bring. Tomorrow is always a new page, new experiences, some good, some bad. We move through those events in trust and faith, trust in our Lord and faith in His Father. It has become my habit to say the following each day before I sit at my computer, I hope one day to be able to look back and think I managed that today!!

Dear Friends,

It has been good to be with you again this summer. Thank you again for your prayers for Gini and myself. We will both be seeing our doctors when we get home in September and, provided all goes well we hope to return in November for a few weeks.

During our stay we have heard of the deaths of three of our friends. In church we missed seeing friends who are no longer with us, either because they have returned to the UK or have died. This is a sad reminder of our own mortality.

In my case, and I'm sure I'm not alone, I am aware that energy levels are decreasing, as is my capacity for remembering, seeing, even with glasses, and hearing, even with aids. Meanwhile increasing aches and pains remind me that my body no longer works as well as it used to do and will continue to deteriorate with age.

Our Christian faith tells us we need not fear. Jesus died and rose again and we believe so shall we. Death has lost its sting. When our time on earth comes to an end a place awaits us in heaven. As the hymn says, 'When the roll is called up yonder, we'll be there.' Thanks be to God.

But the ageing process, with its discomforts and losses, is not pleasant and we can find ourselves wondering what tomorrow holds, and how we may cope with its arrival. God only knows what may come our way but He has promised to be with us no matter what. Nothing can ever separate us from His love for us in Jesus.

Here is a prayer I found this week which blessed me. May it also bless you.

The day is gone, and I give Thee thanks, O Lord.

Evening is at hand, furnish it with brightness.

As day has its evening so has life, the eve of life is old age,

age has overtaken me, furnish it with brightness.

Cast me not away in the time of age; forsake me not when my strength faileth me.
