I wonder how many of us are feeling "flat"? All the anticipation of Christmas, the celebration, the exchange of gifts and good wishes, all over and done with.... Except that the greatest gift of all, that of God's own Son, lives with us and in us for all eternity.

We've thrown away, or recycled the trimmings, eaten the last of the festive grub, promised to go on a diet, made New Year resolutions and so on. Whether those resolutions are kept remains to be seen.

The Christmas season ends with Epiphany which this year falls on a Sunday, the 6th of January. The 'Epiphany' (Greek *epiphaneia* – revealing, manifesting) refers to the revealing of Christ to the 'Magi', the Wise Men from the East who searched for truth and found it at Bethlehem. The main theme of the Epiphany season is the revelation of Christ as the light of the world and the King of **all** nations – Gentiles and Jews.

I commend the following prayer to you, for use daily:

The Wise Men offered gold to Christ, the King of all. Father, we pray for all who take authority to serve their country: our Queen, and the government of this and every nation ...

Give wisdom and integrity to all who lead, that their service will promote justice, peace and human well-being.

The Wise Men offered frankincense to Christ, the Son of God. Father, we pray for the Church's life of worship and prayer, and for all who lead, teach and minister among us ...

Send the Holy Spirit to bless your servants with the gifts they need to build up the Body of Christ, and to strengthen us to be his witnesses in daily life.

The Wise Men offered myrrh to Christ, the Son of Man. We pray for all who suffer from the injustices and frailties of human life ...

Bring deliverance to those who are trapped in grinding poverty, terrifying conflict or brutal oppression ... Strengthen your servants who go to help them. Be close to all who suffer from pain or ill-health ... Grant healing and hope to them all.

We remember with thanksgiving those who have died ... Grant us with them, and with Mary, Joseph and the Wise Men, a share in your eternal Kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

This month sees the celebration of the Week of Prayer for Christian unity, between the 18th and 25th, and we will be joining with our Catholic and Protestant brothers and sisters in a service at Foussais Payré, this year the service has been prepared by Christians in Burkino Fasso and is on the theme "You shall love the Lord your God ... and your neighbour as yourself (Luke 10:27)". I look forward to seeing as many of you there as possible. Details may be found elsewhere in this Edition of Grapevine.

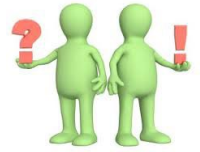

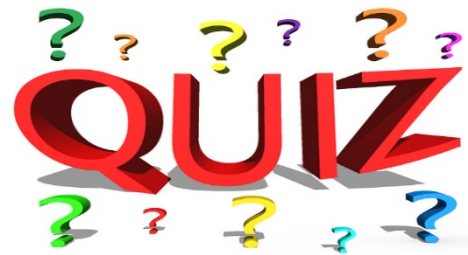

Who was born on Christmas day.

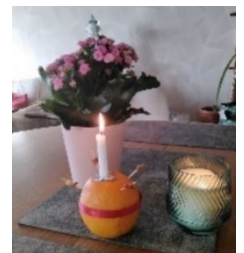
And all who gathered round Him,

Another year of huge changes for us.. the only thing constant is our life is that nothing is constant! Apart from God and our faith, which has kept us strong over the past decades.

January 2023 saw us still resident in France but preparing to move back to the UK. Our house sale went through smoothly, at the end of March, and we moved into the flat in Harrogate with Nel for a few months. We eventually moved into our new home (address above) at the end of June. Since then we, mostly John, have been busy re-decorating the bedrooms and have had artisans in to re-furb the bathroom, re-wire the house and fit a log burner which we will really enjoy these next cold months. The garden has mostly been left to its own devices, although as it is largely paved it remains quite tidy... a job for next year.

This autumn we have taken on a short live-in carers job near Cambridge, being recommended by friends, giving us some much needed cash and allowing Nel to have some time to herself. Unfortunately Nel has yet to find work and so is filling her time with various health care appointments and, of course, the ever present football. After several false starts she now plays for a development team at Newark, a train ride away, her enthusiasm is endless! Her mental health has improved somewhat and she has several statutory agencies helping her each week. She would like to live independently but that is unlikely while she has no employment.

Bec and Phils life has changed this year too, still living near Harrogate but now with Anwen at university and Lou starting at a school for young people with autism their home life has become rather different. Both are really enjoying their new sphere of learning and Ted continues to thrive in the local primary school. Bec had covid for the second time in January and was left with long covid. Due to this, and other issues, she changed jobs in the late summer and is now a Child and Families worker. She is really enjoying the change of pace and works from home some days which is suiting her well. Phil remains busy with parish life and is also benefiting from Lou being at school.

Hannah and Steve are well settled into their house in Sheffield, with Hannah finding her green fingers and getting to grips with life as a practice nurse, which she enjoys very much. Wilf has started uni, choosing to study in Sheffield so still living at home. Amos has GCSE's this coming summer with his eyes set on a career in catering, bringing home delicious meals each week. Steve travels far and wide with his structural engineering work and now has a hybrid car which is a new experience for them all.

Mairs mum, soon to be 96, moved to Bristol in July when Huw and Anna retired from the ministry. She has settled well, finding a postbox within walking distance to keep her letters to friends flowing. She misses her friends in Sandy but is now making new ones at a Day Club in Bath once a week. Their local church is friendly and they have been made very welcome there. We have been criss-crossing the country regularly, visiting Bristol every 4-6weeks to care for mum so that Huw and Anna can have a break

A big thank you to those of you who continue to donate money to our mission fund. This year we have been able to support one of our early students with the setting up of a clinic in the bush for mothers who cannot afford the high hospital fees of the local facility. Happiness has saved half her wages each month, in spite of being alone, for the past 7yrs, to fund this venture. With your money we have helped her to buy mattresses, a delivery bed, wheelchairs, dressing trolley and lab equipment. Please ask for more info if you would like it... we have photos too we can share with you. She has asked us to thank you all, in Jesus name, for your generosity to her and the mothers and babies in her care.

Our year began with Gini's pain and mobility problems increasing, until at the end of January her hip broke. She spent 17 days in hospital getting a new one and having treatment for heart failure. She now has a French hip and an English one. We are so very grateful for the care she has received from the NHS and for the love, prayers and practical support we have both received from our family and friends especially during the early months of the year.

We rejoice that Gini's health is much improved. She's no longer in heart failure (showed by an MRI) and just takes low doses of blood pressure medications which are keeping things steady.

We didn't get to France until May and missed the spring flowers but were able to welcome Bryony and family and to watch the Coronation with our neighbours, Gilles and Brigitte.

We returned to England in June where Gini enjoyed a restorative week at Scargill, including wild swimming in the River Wharfe, whilst Martyn and friends returned to St. Oswald's, Sleights for their annual retreat. Scargill continues to be an important part of our lives and we were glad to be able to resume being Pastoral Helpers there from July onwards.

We returned to France for the summer where we enjoyed visiting Gini's old pen friend from school days and her family in les Landes. Later we were joined by Rowan and family for their summer holidays. The weather was hot and dry, so there were many visits to local swimming pools and lakes as well as sitting in the shade of our fig tree in the garden.

At home in Meltham we continue to enjoy church, the Community Choir and helping in the Food Bank. Martyn's walking group has been joined by a number of ladies so Old Men Walking has now been rebaptised as Walking Friends. We are so thankful to still be able to enjoy the wonderful countryside around us, not to mention the pub lunches.

November was spent in France where we visited Carcassonne with our friends Christine and Philip as part of her 80th birthday celebrations. We were blessed by the weather, the beautiful autumn colours on the vines and the local food and wine. We celebrated Holly's 40th birthday earlier this month with all our family and look forward to seeing everyone again at Christmas. We thank God for them and all of our friends. Call and see us if you are passing our way. In the meantime, we pray for peace and justice in our troubled world and wish you love and joy in the coming year.
