4 thought – May 2021

Very shortly we will be holding our Annual Meeting, this year once again, via the Zoom platform. We seem to be embarking on a new period of hybrid church, as it is becoming known. At Archdeaconry synod we were invited to discuss three questions:

Looking back: what are we missing and not missing in the life of our Chaplaincy as a result of the Covid pandemic?

Looking forward: What are we doing today that we want to keep?

Looking forward: What do we want to do in the coming months and years?

There was vigorous debate in the group I was in. We were remarkably diverse representatives, from Chaplaincies in Paris, Marseille, Cannes and The Vendée. The responses of the whole synod will be collated and published in due course. In the meantime, it might be useful for you all to think about those questions, and hopefully we might be able to have a feedback session, via Zoom? in the near future, as I believe that it will be helpful to the new council in planning our way forward once the confinement is lifted.

I didn't think that I might be vulnerable! Recently I have received a spate of emails, purporting to be from my bank, (La Banque Postale), urging me to beef up security. Click here...it says in the email, which I didn't! Then I got an email from FNAC, thanking me for purchasing very posh, eye watering expensive, mobile phone with my bank card, to be delivered to someone in Toulon! I hadn't! Within 30 minutes I had cancelled the card. I now forward every one of these emails to the fraud department of LBP, most banks have a similar department, so if you are plagued by similar spam mail, send it to your bank, then delete it. Most of us are vulnerable in some respect or another.

You may not even be aware that every Chaplaincy **must** have a Safeguarding Officer, who deals with matters of concern, not just confined to children but also adults, who especially, are vulnerable at this time of COVID. People who may be lonely, or feeling targeted, several people in addition to me, have been subjected to attempts by phone and email, even by letter, to obtain personal bank account details. Others have had strangers calling at their homes, offering to do odd jobs, or go shopping. Beware!

Our Safeguarding Officer is responsible for ensuring that *everyone* with an official role in the Chaplaincy has undergone the right level of training, that's a wide range of folk, from the Chaplain, to our welcomers. You will find her details on the website. Or if you do have concerns, feel free to contact the Chaplain, in confidence.

Two further items of news. After several years, our Pastoral co-ordinator, David Pearson, has indicated a wish to stand down. David has been (still is) a rock of support for many people, responding with sensitivity and speed to urgent requests for prayer. A calm and reassuring voice, liaising with the Chaplain to respond to needs that come to his attention.

If you feel that God has laid it on your heart to volunteer for this most important ministry, please contact David for further information.

Lastly, the Diocese reminded me that Rev. Martyn Crompton's Permission to Officiate was due for renewal. P-to-O allows him to lead worship, preach and preside at the Eucharist. Despite the current lockdown, both Martyn and Gini, are looking forward to being back, and taking part in our worship once again, they both send their very best wishes to everyone here.

ANNUAL MEETING 11.45, Sunday 9th May via Zoom

ASV cannot exist without these positions being filled and so it is essential for nominations to be received to enable voting to take place at the Annual Meeting. This year it will again take place via the Zoom internet platform at 11.45 on Sunday 9th May, following the morning Zoom service. To nominate or serve in any position and to attend and vote at the Annual Meeting you have to be on the Electoral Roll. The Electoral Roll Officer has already written articles in the last two editions of Grapevine and she must "freeze" the Roll on the 24th April at the latest and then she cannot "unfreeze" the Roll until the closure of the Annual Meeting.

The Secretary has received some nominations but, at the time of writing, there are still the following vacancies. Please ask if you need any further details.

TWO vacancies for Council members ONE vacancy for an Archdeaconry Synod Representative.

Churchwardens are only elected to serve one year so this is our last "notes for Grapevine" before the Annual Meeting. It has been a difficult year but we must express our thanks to our Chaplain, Hazel, for her leadership and thanks to all our colleagues on Council for their diligent service to ASV. Let's hope the next 12 months allows us to return to something nearer to "normal"!



Obituary for Herbie Floate

written by his son, Chris Floate

I have been asked to write a few words about my father, Herbert Floate who passed away peacefully on March 17th in Highwell House Nursing Home, Bromyard, Worcestershire, UK



Dad was 95 when he died and no one could deny he had a full and interesting life. If I start at the beginning, He was born in the Sussex town of Washington where he grew up and developed his two main loves, cricket and trains. After finishing school, he was accepted to read geography at Keble College, Oxford. The 2nd world war got in the way a little and my only real knowledge of this period of dad’s life is his recollection of riding a huge motorbike, delivering messages along the South Coast. He found this as terrifying as any threat of invasion! With war out of the way, he returned to Oxford where he met his future wife Nora, also studying geography at Oxford.

Throughout his life dad fluctuated between two careers or should I say one career and one calling. Initially he managed to bring both together, his love of travel and his calling to the church through the SPG. Society for the propagation of the gospel. With three small children mum and dad embarked a ship bound for Mauritius, where he worked at the C of E school. My younger sister was born during this time, and when it was time to leave, dad took a position at another Indian Ocean Island, Seychelles.

He returned to the UK with his wife and now four children where he took a teaching job in Sleaford, Lincolnshire. Our youngest brother, Richard was born here and it was here that Dad was ordained. He then took on the parish of Mareham le Fen, also in Lincolnshire. Dad's wander lust was soon to return and he was given the job as Chaplain of a Private School in Perth, Western Australia. Unfortunately, they had advertised the job anticipating that the existing Chaplain, who was very unwell, was not going to survive. Communication was not the best in the 60's and during the five week voyage to Australia, the Chaplain made a full recovery and met dad off, the boat!

After a number of teaching positions, he joined the geography department at the University of Western Australia as a lecturer. After seven years he returned to the UK and took up a Parish at Harlaxton, outside Grantham in Lincolnshire. A special place for me as my future wife was one of the choir girls.

From there he took a teaching post at the teacher training college in Bromsgrove, Worcestershire, and then the Parish of Grafton Flyford in Worcestershire. The church at Grafton Flyford is where dad's body is laid to rest.

Again, dad's wanderings got the better of him and he applied for a job on the Indian Ocean island of Rodrigues. Dad was in his early 60s by this time and he was responsible for both the school and the church. After this contract, they returned to the UK. and 'retired'.

They spent much time in both France and Spain and dad being dad, he was soon involved with the church. In Spain he played a key role setting up a church for the Anglican community there. This kept him and mum busy for a number of years, and when he felt things were on an even keel and he could leave, he returned to UK yet again, and they moved to Coleford in Gloucestershire.

From here, they would spend much of their time in La Vendee in a unit they had purchased on a beautiful camping site. They shared a wonderful part of their life with friends they had made and this really was a well-earned retirement for both of them. Mum passed away in France and is buried in the graveyard at St Martin Lars. My wife and I pay her a visit each year when returning from our camping holiday.

At this time, dad met the clergy involved in La Vendee and dad being dad, he couldn't resist getting involved. Dad remained involved and made many wonderful friends during this period who have expressed their feelings and thoughts with me. Dad was involved until he was too old to keep driving back and forth to France.

He spent the last period of his life in Ledbury, Herefordshire, where three of his children were within an easy commute. He had many visits from friends who would drop in for a cuppa or a bite to eat whenever they were travelling up or down the country, and his garden and Sky's cricket coverage gave him many hours of joy.

Dad was still looking after himself (with the odd bit of help), walking up and down stairs, preparing all his own meals up to five weeks before he left us. He started falling over and within a 24-hour period he was really poorly and taken to hospital. His last 10 days were spent in the nursing home who looked after him magnificently. Even with covid restrictions, we could all talk to him using WhatsApp so he never felt alone. On his final day, the nursing home rang me to say that I could go and sit by his bedside. Although he was sedated, they assured me he could hear, so he had to spend his last day, listening to me, rabbit on about all the things we had shared in our lives. I had the privilege of being there, holding his hand as he left us, he passed away very peacefully knowing he was loved and cared for.

PLANNED GIVING THROUGH THE STANDING ORDER SCHEME

Some people have been asking how to make a donation to ASV.

Here are the details:

All Saints Vendée has had to change banks. I have written to everyone who contributes to the Planned Giving Scheme, asking them to change their virement (standing order). Please can anyone affected change their payments as soon as possible.

If anyone else would like to join the Planned Giving scheme, or to make a donation, please ask me for the details of the new banking arrangements. (mcgregor@lalogette.com)

ADVANTAGES:

If you set up a standing order (virement) through your French bank, online, it is cost-free.

You stay in total control of what you give – the standing order (virement) can be changed at any time, but only by you!

Only the Treasurer knows how much you give per month.

You know what you are giving, and exactly when the money comes out of your account, and so your budgeting is much easier.

If you complete a French tax form, then *you will get a significant rebate* (depending on your situation) at the end of each financial year.

If your French tax bill is small, then you will pay no tax at all!

ASV can plan ahead much more effectively, as it knows what contributions are coming in, rather than guessing who is going to be at church!

DISADVANTAGES:

I can't think of any, so why not come and join the party!

and for British residents:

If you do *not* have a French bank account, but would like to support the work of ASV, then please contact me, and I can help you. Please note, you cannot use tax-efficient giving in both France *and* the UK.

REVISION OF THE ASV ELECTORAL ROLL

The Electoral Roll of a church is completely updated every six years - this was last done in 2019. Once updated, the Electoral Roll Officer is required to revise the Roll each year shortly before the Annual Meeting (AGM). The Council have now fixed the date for the AGM and it will take place at 11.45 on Zoom after the Zoom service on Sunday May 9th 2021. The revision has to be completed not later than 15 days before the AGM (i.e. April 24th.) and not earlier than 28 days before the AGM (i.e. April 11th.). Once it has been revised, the Roll is "frozen" until after the AGM has taken place.

If anyone wishes to join the ASV Electoral Roll, please complete an Application form and return it to me as soon as possible. An application form can be obtained from me or you can download the copy and notes found elsewhere in Grapevine. If anyone wishes to have their name removed from the Roll, please contact me. If you are on the Roll, and wish to remain on the Roll then there is nothing you need to do.

Only people on the Electoral Roll are allowed to nominate or stand for Churchwarden or a Council Member. Again only Roll members may attend the AGM and vote in elections or for motions at the AGM. In other words, membership of the Electoral Roll is the way to be able to take an active part in the life of the church. 2C I am a member in good standing of a Church not in communion with the Church of England which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and also declare myself to be a member of the Church of England and I have habitually attended public worship in the chaplaincy during the period of six months prior to enrolment.

I declare that the above answers are true and I apply for inclusion on the church electoral roll for the chaplaincy.

Please return by hand or by post to the Electoral Roll Officer, Chris Green, La Vialière, 79240 Largeasse – or by hand to the Chaplain, a Warden or any Council Member.

Notes. 1. Like many churches in France we enjoy active participation of people who spend part of their time back in the UK or elsewhere. Accordingly, we follow the advice of the Diocese in Europe and adopt a generous interpretation of the six month rule.

2. If you have any problem with this form, please approach any member of the Church Council who will be pleased to help you.

Notes to be read regarding the Electoral Roll Application Form

1. The only churches at present in communion with the Church of England are other Anglican Churches and certain foreign Churches.

2. Membership of the Electoral Roll is also open to members in good standing of a Church not in communion with the Church of England which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity where those members are also prepared to declare themselves to be members of the Church of England.

3. Every six years a new roll is prepared and those on the previous roll are informed so that they can re-apply. If you are not resident but were on the roll as an habitual worshipper and have been prevented by sickness or absence or other essential reason from worshipping for the past six months, you may write "would" before "have habitually attended" on the form and add "but was prevented from doing so because" and then state the reason.

4. If you have any problems over this form, please approach the clergy or lay people responsible for the chaplaincy, who will be pleased to help you.

5. Use of email addresses and other personal data is governed by local laws on Data Protection applying to the chaplaincy and by the Privacy Notice on the Chaplaincy's website.

6. The Diocese in Europe is subject to local laws in the host nation for the chaplaincy. Chaplaincy Governance is conducted under the Church Representation Rules as local laws and the Diocesan Constitution allow. Any necessary departures from the CRRs that have to apply in Europe are catered for in the Diocesan Constitution.

You do not have to provide an email address on this Form. If you do provide one, the Chaplaincy Council and the electoral roll officer are entitled to use that email address to communicate with you in connection with the maintenance or revision of the Roll or the preparation of a new Roll or with elections to or membership of the Council.

The Church Representation Rules impose certain requirements for your name and address to be given to a third party, such as the diocesan electoral registration officer, who may require it in connection with elections to or membership of a deanery synod, diocesan synod or the House of Laity of the General Synod. If you provide an email address on this Form, it will be given to the third party along with your postal address.

A third party to whom your name and address have been given under the Church Representation Rules is in certain cases required by the Rules to pass them on to another person, such as the presiding officer in a synodical election. If you provide an email address on this Form, that email address will be given to the other person along with your postal address.

Any person to whom your email address or other personal data is given under the Church Representation Rules is required by those Rules to hold the data securely. Furthermore, if you do provide an email address on this Form, that does not give anybody the right to use it for any purpose other than those permitted by the Rules; so it cannot, for example, be used for social matters or fund-raising. Those permissions have to be granted in a process other than Electoral Roll enrolment in accordance with the chaplaincy privacy policy.

The roll is published after each annual revision and after the preparation of a new roll. The published roll will include your name (as well as the name of every other person on the roll) but none of your other personal data (as defined by the Data Protection law in place) and will be made public as a result of your inclusion on the roll.




